The 10th NIFISA Seminar Sports Performance Course Kagoshima & Tokyo Japan 28 August – 7 September 2019

Candidate Criteria

The candidate/s:

- 1. should be aged ranging from 22 to 39;
- 2. should hold a passionate interest in sports performance and the Olympic Movement, and be an up-and-coming leader in a sports profession (e.g. graduate student or higher degree holder, young researcher, top coach, national level athlete, etc.);
- 3. should possess advanced level knowledge and skills in sports science;
- 4. should possess English language proficiency to understand the seminars in English and communicate effectively with other students and professors (with the score of TOEIC 650, TOFEL (iBT) 70, IELT 5.0, or international experience of one year or more in an English-speaking country). Supporting document must be attached;
- 5. should be F.6 or above or equivalent in academic qualification. Documentary proof on the qualification and a recommendation letter from the profession currently engaged are required;
- will <u>NOT</u> be considered if they have previously attended the annual International Session for Young Participants organized by the International Olympic Academy or other overseas study tours liaised by the Federation;
- 7. should be nominated by NSA/Federation with the nomination letter from the President/ Chairman/ Hon. Secretary of the respective Association.
- 8. can be retired or serving athletes or coaches. Sports performance results/ records should be provided;
- who are the other personnel related to sports such as serving staff members of NSAs
 are also acceptable provided that they satisfy the above listed criteria and at <u>Sports</u>
 <u>Executive or above grade</u> and with <u>at least two years' working experience</u> in the same
 NSA; and
- 10. should have demonstrated a special interest in participating through their submission of <u>not more than 300 words</u> attached to his or her application for the Hong Kong Olympic Academy's consideration on the aims or the motive of participation of the events and any other Olympism sharing.
